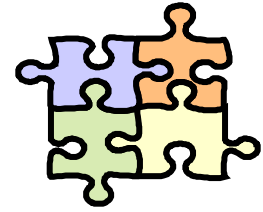

Frequently Asked Questions

Who should attend Camp Crossroads?

Camp Crossroads is for children who will be entering Kindergarten in the upcoming school year up to 17 years of age who are on the Autism Spectrum or that have a similar diagnosis. The child must possess basic communication skills (of any mode), basic self-help skills, and a foundation of safety awareness. They also must be non-aggressive to others and cannot have a history of elopement.

When and where does my child attend Camp Crossroads?

Camp Crossroads is held in conjunction with the YMCA of Indiana County. The camp is run in two sessions. Session one is held Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:15am-3:15pm and Session two is typically scheduled for Tuesday and Thursday from 8:15am-3:15pm.

Is there sufficient, reliable staff available to work with my child at Camp Crossroads?

Absolutely! Our staff ratio will be 1:3 for 27 camp participants, and all staff will be trained in how to work with children on the Autism Spectrum. FBR offers a comprehensive training program on Autism Spectrum Disorders, including introductory foundation training and leading up to advanced trainings on miscellaneous treatment modalities.

Why should my child attend Camp Crossroads?

We at Camp Crossroads have many goals for your children! Goals of Camp Crossroads are to increase their socialization skills, enhance their communication skills, and provide them opportunities for reciprocal interactions with typically developing peers. Camp Crossroads aims to be a unique inclusion camp for children with Autism and related disorders.

What types of activities will be available at Camp Crossroads?

Activities coincide with the themes for the YMCA's Summer Day Camp. Children will have the opportunity to swim each day. Various field trips are also scheduled such as to the Altoona Curves Games, the Carnegie Science Center, and Lakemont Park.



How will the children be divided at Camp Crossroads?

Children are divided by age; typically by grades K-2, 3-5, and 6-12.

Is there transportation available for the children of Camp Crossroads?

Yes. Transportation will be provided via the Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP) if the parents are unable to transport their children.

Are meals provided at Camp Crossroads?

No. Parents need to provide lunch and snack, as well as adequate water for their children.

How do I enroll my child in Camp Crossroads?

To make a referral, please call the FBR Indiana office, and provide the contact information for the child and family. When we are ready to proceed with intakes for participants, an administrator will contact families on a first-come, first-serve basis. **Inquiries about this program may be directed to Amy Flickinger or Corinne Miller at 724-463-3600 or indiana@familybehavioralresources.com.**
